



Membership Goals are initially based on Chapter size, based on a formula established by the Executive Officer, in conjunction with the Director of Membership.

- If Chapter size is <25, the annual goal is 6.
- If Chapter size is ≥25, but <40, the annual goal is 8.
- If Chapter size is ≥40, but <55, the annual goal is 10.
- If Chapter size is ≥55, but <70, the annual goal is 12.
- If Chapter size is ≥70, but <85, the annual goal is 14.
- If Chapter size is ≥85, but <100, the annual goal is 16.
- If Chapter size is ≥100, the annual goal is 20.

In the event that majorities equal or exceed the membership goal, the goal will be modified only to ensure that no goal is set lower than growth by at least one new member.

All membership goals for PMC-MSA eligibility shall be those goals in effect as of the date of the Master Councilor's installation. For a Master Councilor to be eligible for PMC-MSA eligibility shall be based upon either (1) whether the chapter initiated his share of all initiates during the months of his term (i.e., half of the goal during a 6-month term), or (2) the chapter meets its membership goal during the calendar year, regardless of whether the initiates were initiated during his term.

DeMolay International Distinguished Service Award

2025-2026 Nominations are now OPEN!

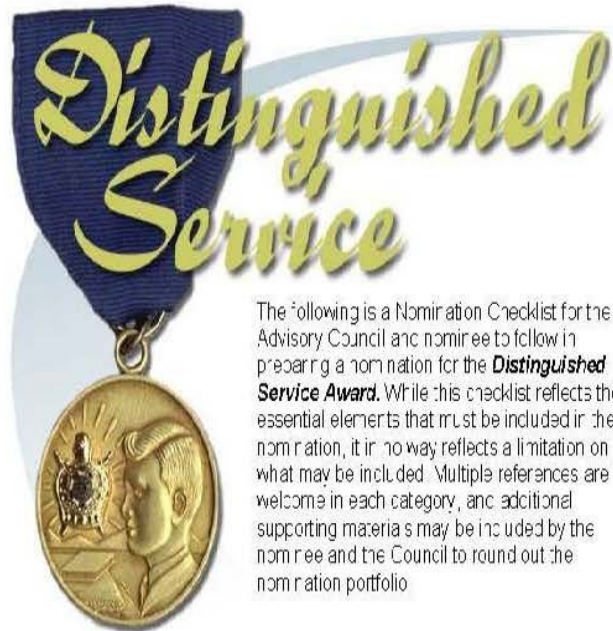
The Distinguished Service Award (“DSA”) recognizes outstanding overall service by a DeMolay in various fields of life. The purpose of the DSA is to recognize a DeMolay member’s outstanding service to others in his home, school church, community, county and Chapter.

Established by DeMolay International in 1959, it is awarded to a maximum of two (2) DeMolay members per jurisdiction per year, and complete applications for consideration **MUST** be received by May 15. Of those two recipients each year, the Executive Officer will transmit one of the two winners to DeMolay International for its consideration as DeMolay International “DeMolay of the Year”. If a member is not selected as a recipient, his advisory council may re-submit his nomination for consideration the following year, with any additional materials they deem necessary in support of his application. It should be noted that this award is different from (but may, in fact, be awarded to), the same individual who receives the honor of New Jersey DeMolay of the Year, as selected by the State Master Councilor and the Jurisdictional Officers.

Since the DSA is an award, rather than an honor, the prospective recipient may participate actively in preparing his own nomination. Applications may be submitted at any time; however, recipients will only be notified of their selection at the annual banquet of New Jersey DeMolay each June. The Executive Officer, in consultation with other staff, selects the recipients from among qualified applicants, and he further may submit his own nomination if no nominations are received from any chapter during the year. It is strongly recommended that for a candidate to receive this award, he first must have received the Representative DeMolay Award and Lamp of Knowledge.

There is no standard form for applying for the DSA. Rather, the applicant, working with his local Advisory Council, assembles a package of materials demonstrating his service in various areas. The local Advisory Council generally assists in soliciting recommendations from individuals who have worked with the applicants in various areas of service. The nomination for the Award officially comes from the Advisory Council, though a member may apply for his own nomination through his Advisory Council.

The information below will help you in assembling an application for the DSA and outlines the essential information that should be included. The package of materials should reflect the personality and experience of the nominee, while showcasing his qualifications to be designated as truly distinguished in his service, both in DeMolay and beyond.



The following is a Nomination Checklist for the Advisory Council and nominee to follow in preparing a nomination for the **Distinguished Service Award**. While this checklist reflects the essential elements that must be included in the nomination, it in no way reflects a limitation on what may be included. Multiple references are welcome in each category, and additional supporting materials may be included by the nominee and the Council to round out the nomination portfolio.

Step 1: Select a Nominee

Your Chapter's Advisory Council may select an outstanding DeMolay for each six month term. Each nominee should be active in the basic areas listed below. The Advisory Council should formally act on the nomination, and include a signed certification form with the nomination.

Step 2: Gather Endorsement and Recommendation Letters

Letters explaining your nominee's activities and outstanding qualities in the following basic areas must be attached with the summary sheet. These letters should be from reputable persons of the community who know of the nominee's activities.

The nominee should provide contact information for these potential endorsers, and the Advisory Council should send letters to them, requesting that they provide a letter of recommendation to the Council for inclusion in the DSA nomination. A completed nomination should contain *at least one* endorsement in each of these areas:

Area of Activity	Recommendations from ...	Letter Should Cover
Religious Life	Minister, Priest, Rabbi, Sunday School Teacher, or other religious leader.	Attendance, youth group activities, choir, camp, or other services rendered to his faith community, and general character.
Education	Teachers, Administrators, Coaches. High School and/or college.	Grade average, ability and effort, and honors earned. All clubs, school sponsored activities participated in, and general character.
Community	Civic leaders, organization advisors	All activities which provide services to the community, jurisdiction, or state. Also service to clubs like Boy Scouts, YMCA and other civic-type organizations.
Home	Parents and/or close family and friends	Describe regular home duties, attitude, cooperation. All special services and assistance to the family, and general character.
DeMolay	Chapter Advisor or other Advisors, Deputy Executive Officer, Executive Officers' Staff	All offices held and all honors and awards. Committee service, Chapter and state-wide service and honors. This area must be covered in great detail and should only contain DeMolay information. Give years applicable.
Other	Employers, other persons who can offer insight to the candidate	Employment record and any activity which falls under service to humanity and is not covered elsewhere.
Recommendation	Advisory Council Chairman	Appropriate remarks explaining reasons for selection and recommendation only.

Step 3: Complete the Summary

A summary (see sample) of the nominee's activities for the last four years must be included with all nominations. The more complete this summary is, the better the nominee's chances for selection.

Step 4: Enclose a Photo of the Nominee

A quality "head and shoulders" photo of the nominee should be included to be used in publicity. The photo shall be e-mailed to the Executive Officer.

Step 5: Send Nomination Material to the Executive Officer

Aside from the photo, please MAIL all materials in one envelope or package. The completed portfolio should be sent to the Executive Officer for his review. All documents must be sent via mail in order to ensure that all documents are properly then transmitted to the DeMolay International Service and Leadership Center for further consideration.

Beyond this Chapter

Through my presence in this organization over the last five years, time has passed with grace. Whether it be years, months, weeks, or days, a mere fraction of this time since the summer of 2021 has been spent without brotherhood, thanks to this organization.

The summer of 2021 was one I will never forget, no matter how much time will pass throughout my life. The first people I saw after opening the doors to 1496 Van Houten Ave, some of whom are in the room today, have stood by my side for all of these years, acting as the older brothers. After these first interactions with my new "brothers," I felt a sense of security, and saw people I could genuinely look up to. Weeks went by, and my decision to join DeMolay was one of the biggest moments in my life. On the twenty-ninth of September, 2021, I had taken my obligations, and been installed as a new member of Clifton Chapter, by Andrew Gonzalez. I received my collar and polo at Winterfest, and I had been included in the state group chats and calls. Brother Thomas Siegel's DeMolay Resume

Salutations Brethren, I am Thomas Siegel from Kenneth E. Hendrickson chapter, and I am running for the office of State Senior Councilor. My DeMolay career has ignited in me a profound desire to give back to the organization by drawing on my personal experiences, and I have developed a plan to continue to improve New Jersey DeMolay to new heights with a focus on organizational growth.

My Experience Joining DeMolay

It was my father who told me about DeMolay. We were driving in the car one afternoon and, after explaining to me what DeMolay was, he told me that someone was trying to restart a chapter in my town of Mount Olive. I began asking him questions about his time in DeMolay and he explained to me that joining DeMolay was one of the best choices he made in his youth. He told me that even though he was in Boy Scouts and DECA he found little enjoyment to go along with their educational value, however, upon joining DeMolay he met people who changed the course of his life, and was able to take part in the planning of events that he wanted to do. Unfortunately, this can be a common occurrence for chapters that are trying to get started, or are in a desperate need of membership.

However, after joining DeMolay, I attended the KeyMan conference, talking with experienced DeMolays from all around the continent, Then I eventually planned a Nerf Event with Dad Vander Horn, and I was able to sign 7 members in one night. From that point I went on to help lead the revival of K.E.H. Chapter as Master Councilor which was named the 2024-2025 Most Improved Chapter. Personally, my work with my home chapter has resulted in my earning the Past Master Councilor's Meritorious Service Award, a Blue Honor Key for signing 10 new members, and being honored as the 2024-2025 New Jersey DeMolay of the Year. This type of chapter and individual growth is something I want to help all of New Jersey DeMolay accomplish.

What DeMolay Has Done For Me

Over the course of my DeMolay career, I've found that I have changed for the better. When I first joined DeMolay, I was less confident, shy, quiet, and introverted. I feel like DeMolay has allowed me to become more confident than the majority of my peers, extroverted, and able to talk to anyone. DeMolay caused me to make this change by putting me in the uncomfortable situation of being the only member of my chapter and having to bring other people in. But that also gave me the opportunity to take charge and become a leader. To put it simply, I've found that there are more benefits to being outgoing than there are to being withdrawn.

I value the people in DeMolay more than anything else. I feel like I can absolutely rely on all my DeMolay brothers to be as loyal to me as I am to them. I know that if I need assistance or advice, one of my DeMolay brothers will happily provide it. For that reason, I

Out of all of the things that I do outside of DeMolay, Brazilian Jiu Jitsu has benefited me the most. It made me realize that appearance is deceiving, and that though the odds may be against you, you can still succeed.

My Goal While In The Elected Line.

My top priority is membership. It is what I've been best at during my time as a DeMolay. I especially feel like I owe it to other new chapters or chapters that have struggled with membership, to help them succeed and give them advice, and my experiences with getting members. I plan on strengthening each chapter's social media campaigns, and helping everyone be more outgoing and able to talk to people about DeMolay. Getting new members is what I am good at, and I have a lot of ideas to share with everyone about how they can get members. If by the end of my term, I will be able to help a temporary chapter become permanent, and help other DeMolays directly, I will have succeeded because I want every member to get the full chapter experience that I have been lucky enough to have helped craft at KEH.
